On our drive back from Pawley's Island, SC we stopped in Charlotte, NC and visited Samaritan's Feet. It is a neat ministry that provides shoes to impoverished people all over the world. They've worked in 109 countries and 600 U.S. cities. Our favorite part about the ministry is that they wash the feet of every individual receiving the shoes and share the gospel with them first. They even have their own shoe they developed which is biodegradable, a huge benefit to those in impoverished countries that don't have the same trash removal protocols we do in the States. We recommend you check out the founder's book *Sole Purpose* by Manny Ohonme. We are excited to see what kind of partnership may arise with Samaritan's Feet as we serve in Burundi next year.
